# **Community Hall Exhibit Rules and Regulations**

The Dillsburg Community Fair Association has the sole authority to reject any entries, displays or other submissions deemed inappropriate.

The public may enter articles for display at the Dillsburg Community Hall (located behind the Fire Hall) on Tuesday evening from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m., Wednesday evening from 5:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. and Thursday morning from 8:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. All baked goods must be entered Wednesday and Thursday. All entries must be completed by 11:00 a.m. Judging in all departments is done by professionals.

PLEASE NOTE: Department 19 Art Work & Photography is for Amateurs Only. Entry times are Tuesday from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Wednesday from 5:00 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. The Community Hall will not open for entries on Wednesday until 5 p.m.

We will accept no more than three (3) entries per person in each class and they cannot have been entered in previous fairs. All pictures must have proper wiring or hooks for hanging. PLEASE READ AND ABIDE BY THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, TAK-ING INTO CONSIDERATION OUR LIMITATIONS OF SPACE. THANK YOU.

The Chairman of the department may at their discretion refuse any and all exhibits after the above dates and hours.

Judging will begin at 11:00 a.m. Thursday.

Department superintendents may enter exhibits in their own departments, but neither they nor any other exhibitor may communicate with the judges during the time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the judges.

Any exhibitor interfering with the judges while making awards shall forfeit any premium to which he would otherwise be entitled.

Entered exhibits may not be withdrawn.

**DEPARTMENT 8 - EGGS** 

No exhibits may be removed from display before Saturday at 10:00 p.m., and then only on presentation of CLAIM STUB. Hours for removing exhibits are Saturday at 10:00 p.m., Sunday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Premium cards and ribbons must be displayed for the duration of the fair. Failure to do so will be cause to forfeit cash awards.

All exhibits must be removed from the Community Hall on Saturday between 10:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. and between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Sunday. After such time, all remaining articles will be disposed of as the Chairman shall deem proper. Any proceeds realized shall be placed in the Association Treasury.

# 2D or not 2D? That is the CROP ART question!

It's been 21 lucky years since the traditional Dillsburg Farmers Fair Crop Art competition got under way and 14 years for the 3D Crop Art competition. The traditional Crop Art contest is for flat or 2D entries. These are flat pieces that could be hung on a wall. The 3D competition adds another dimension to the contest. These 3D entries are more like a sculpture that would sit on a table. See Events Calendar for days and times the Community Hall is open for entries during Fair week.

#### **The Rules: Traditional Crop Art**

This contest calls for entrants to create a piece of artwork entire-



#### The Rules: Crop Art 3D

Entries in this category are to be three-dimension-



ly out of dry seeds and beans. Entries in this category would include but are not limited to portraits, landscapes, and other pictures that would normally be painted. Submitted artwork will be judged on overall artistic merit, cleverness of subject, technique, originality, and skill. The natural color of the seeds and beans provides the only pigment to the pictures as no paint or dyes are allowed. Only seeds and beans that are used for crops that can be grown in Pennsylvania may be used. No portion of the seedpod is to be used in the artwork. The artwork is to be completely and exclusively created from whole and unadulterated naturally colored seeds and beans. Seeds should be affixed permanently to the flat surface with a clear or invisible adhesive. A clear protective finish may be applied. Seed portion of artwork must be less than 3/4" thick. (If work is mounted on 1/2" thick board the total thickness of entry must be less than 1 1/4".) Seeds may be layered or partially layered on

top of one another as long as the total thickness doesn't exceed 3/4". Crop Art pictures are to be no larger than 400 square inches in area and mounted on a stiff flat board such as plywood. It is not necessary that the board be rectangular. Pictures may have frames but frames are not required. No portion of mounting board is to be visible. Mounting board must be completely covered with seeds. There should not be glass or plastic covering the artwork. An unsigned 4" by 6" legend card must accompany the artwork with title and samples of the seeds used in the artwork clearly and neatly identified.

Clay, foam, natural or manmade objects may be used as the base material but no portion of this base is to be visible. No glue or supports are to be visible. Entire work must be covered with seeds so no props can be used. Work should be displayed on a board or support that is also completely covered with seeds. Entire installation must fit on a 12"

deep shelf and no higher or wider than 24". Submitted artwork will be judged on overall artistic merit, cleverness of subject, technique, originality, and skill. The natural color of the seeds and beans provides the only pigment to the pictures as no paint or dyes are allowed. A clear protective finish may be applied. Only seeds and beans that are used for crops that can be grown in Pennsylvania may be used. No portion of the seedpod is to be used in the artwork. An unsigned 4" by 6" legend card must accompany the artwork with title and samples of the seeds used in the artwork clearly identified.


