# Community Hall Exhibit Rules and Regulations 

The Dillsburg Community Fair Association has the sole authority to reject any entries, displays or other submissions deemed inappropriate.

The public may enter articles for display at the Dillsburg Community Hall (located behind the Fire Hall) on Tuesday evening from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m., Wednesday evening from 5:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. and Thursday morning from 8:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. All baked goods must be entered Wednesday and Thursday. All entries must be completed by 11:00 a.m. Judging in all departments is done by professionals.

PLEASE NOTE: Department 19 Art Work \& Photography is for Amateurs Only. Entry times are Tuesday from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. and Wednesday from 5:00 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Thursday from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. The Community Hall will not open for entries on Wednesday until 5 p.m.

We will accept no more than three (3) entries per person in each class and they cannot have been entered in previous fairs. All pictures must have proper wiring or hooks for hanging. PLEASE READ AND ABIDE BY THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION OUR LIMITATIONS OF SPACE. THANK YOU.

The Chairman of the department may at their discretion refuse any and all exhibits after the above dates and hours.

Judging will begin at 11:00 a.m. Thursday.
Department superintendents may enter exhibits in their own departments, but neither they nor any other exhibitor may communicate with the judges during the time of determining the awards, except to answer questions proposed by the judges.

Any exhibitor interfering with the judges while making awards shall forfeit any premium to which he would otherwise be entitled.

Entered exhibits may not be withdrawn.
No exhibits may be removed from display before Saturday at 10:00 p.m., and then only on presentation of CLAIM STUB. Hours for removing exhibits are Saturday at 10:00 p.m., Sunday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Premium cards and ribbons must be displayed for the duration of the fair. Failure to do so will be cause to forfeit cash awards.

The Fair Association assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to exhibits from any cause. The Fair Association will exercise care in handling the exhibits, but only on these conditions are they accepted.

In absence of competition, the right is reserved to award a premium the article merits.
All exhibits must have been made, grown, produced, or processed, by the exhibitor or some of his family within the past year.

No prizes or ribbons will be awarded for an article which does not come under a class in the premium list. Prize money will be mailed within 30 days and should be cashed promptly.

While it is the desire of the Association to pay all premiums in full, should a contingency arise whereby the receipts of the Association are insufficient to do so, then in that event the right is reserved to pay prorate in all exhibition classes after deducting expenses and the amount so paid shall discharge the obligation of the Association of the current year.

All exhibits must be removed from the Community Hall on Saturday between 10:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. and between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Sunday. After such time, all remaining articles will be disposed of as the Chairman shall deem proper. Any proceeds realized shall be placed in the Association Treasury.

## 2D or not 2D? That is the CROP ART question!

## It's been 21 lucky years since the traditional Dillsburg Farmers Fair Crop Art competition got under way and 14 years for the 3D Crop Art competition. The traditional

 Crop Art contest is for flat or 2D entries. These are flat pieces that could be hung on a wall. The 3D competition adds another dimension to the contest. These 3D entries are more like a sculpture that would sit on a table. See Events Calendar for days and times the Community Hall is open for entries during Fair week.
## The Rules: Traditional Crop Art

This contest calls for entrants to create a piece of artwork entirely out of dry seeds and beans. Entries in this category would include but are not limited to portraits, landscapes, and other pictures that would normally be painted. Submitted artwork will be judged on overall artistic merit, cleverness of subject, technique, originality, and skill. The natural color of the seeds and beans provides the only pigment to the pictures as no paint or dyes are allowed. Only seeds and beans that are used for crops that can be grown in Pennsylvania may be used. No portion of the seedpod is to be used in the artwork. The artwork is to be completely and exclusively created from whole and unadulterated naturally colored seeds and beans. Seeds should be affixed permanently to the flat surface with a clear or invisible adhesive. A clear protective finish may be applied. Seed portion of artwork must be less than $3 / 4 "$ thick. (If work is mounted on $1 / 2$ " thick board the total thickness of entry must be less than $11 / 4 "$.) Seeds may be layered or partially layered on top of one another as long as the total thickness doesn't exceed 3/4". Crop Art pictures are to be no larger than 400 square inches in area and mounted on a stiff flat board such as plywood. It is not necessary that the board be rectangular. Pictures may have frames but frames are not required. No portion of mounting board is to be visible. Mounting board must be completely covered with seeds. There should not be glass or plastic covering the artwork. An unsigned 4" by 6" legend card must accompany the artwork with title and samples of the seeds used in the artwork clearly and neatly accompany
identified.

## The Rules: Crop Art 3D

 Entries in this category are to be three-dimensional sculptures of whatever support material is al sculptures of whatever support material is chosen covered entirely with dry seeds and/or beans. Clay, foam, natural or manmade objects may be used as the base material but no portion of this base is to be visible. No glue or supports are to be visible. Entire work must be covered with seeds so no props can be used. Work should be displayed on a board or support that is also completely covered with seeds. Entire installation must fit on a 12 "
 deep shelf and no higher or wider than $24^{\prime \prime}$. Submitted artwork will be judged on overall artistic merit, cleverness of subject, technique, originality, and skill. The natural color of the seeds and beans provides the only pigment to the pictures as no paint or dyes are allowed. A clear protective finish may be applied. Only seeds and beans that are used for crops that can be grown in Pennsylvania may be used. No portion of the seedpod is to be used in the artwork. An unsigned 4 " by 6 " legend card must accompany the artwork with title and samples of the seeds used in the artwork clearly identified.

4. The entire pie must be submitted for judging in a disposable pan. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
5. The recipe for the pie and pie crust must be submitted with the entry. It should be printed on one side of $81 / 2$ " x 11 " paper. The recipe must list all ingredi ents, quantities, and the preparation instructions. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and pies will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
6. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.
7. Judging will be based on the following criteria:

8. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair or PA Farm Show. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe. Those entries will not be sold, auctioned or otherwise distributed for consumption after judging for food safety reasons.



## 2023 PSACF Junior Baking Contest - Cookies, Brownies and Bars

RULES: Entries will be received only Wednesday 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. and Thursday 8 a.m. until 11 a.m.

1. Participant must be an individual amateur baker (age 8 through \& including 18 years old) who is a Pennsylvania resident. One entry per person.
2. Entrants may not have won 1st place in this PA Preferred Junior Cookies, Brownie or Bar contest at any other fair in 2023.
3. Entry must be a plate of size (6) individual sized portions of the baked entry items.
4. Entries must be made from scratch. Pre-made mixes are not acceptable ingredients.
5. At least two (2) PA Preferred ingredients must be used in the recipe. Some examples of qualifying ingredients are PA Preferred grains such as oats or flour, butter, milk, eggs, fruits and/or vegetables.
6. Entry must be submitted for judging on a food safe disposable setting. (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned).
7. Recipe(s) must be submitted with the entry, printed on one side of $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ paper. Recipe must list all ingredients, quantities, and the preparation instructions. PA Preferred ingredients must be listed clearly in the ingredient list, specifying the ingredient and the company that made/grew them (ex: PA Preferred Milk - Galliker's brand). Entrant's name, age, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of all the pages. (All recipes and cookies, brownies or bars will become the property of the Fair or PA Farm Show and will not be returned.)
8. The PA Preferred logo is not required because not all PA Preferred products carry the label. The name of the ingredient and the source is sufficient.
